SUMMARY OF CURRENT OKLAHOMA ECONOMIC CONDITIONS

In Oklahoma, the unemployment rate was 4.1 percent in December, and total payroll employment expanded 1.2 percent compared to the previous year. Employment growth was mixed across industries, with the strongest gains in the mining and logging and construction sectors. Oklahoma nominal personal income grew 2.1 in the third quarter of 2017 compared to the previous year, with workplace earnings up 2.1 percent. Home prices increased 4.0 percent in the third quarter of 2017 compared to a year ago, while single-family and multifamily permits recorded a 3.2 and -51.8 percent change, respectively, in 2017. In November 2017, crude oil production was up 21.7 percent over last year, and rig counts were well above year-ago levels. Oklahoma exports were 8.1 percent higher in 2017 compared to 2016.

This databook provides current economic indicators to help monitor trends and allow comparison of past information. These indicators include: employment; employment by industry; county and state unemployment; personal income; home prices; housing indicators; manufacturing activity; oil, gas and coal production; and exports. These indicators can be found on the following pages.



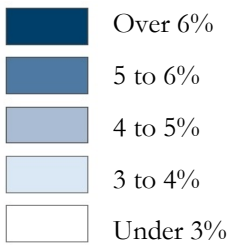
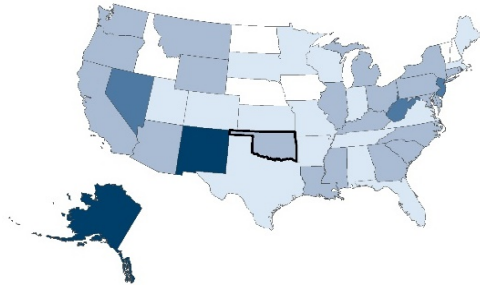

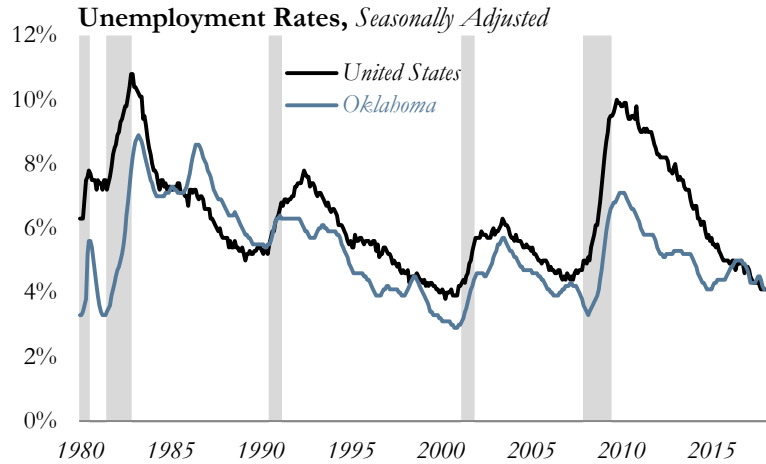

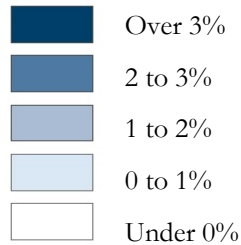

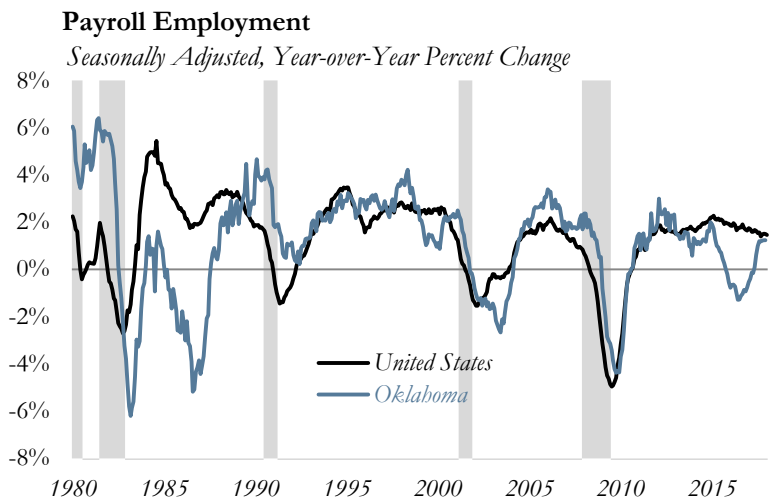

Seasonally Adjusted, Year-over-Year Percent Change



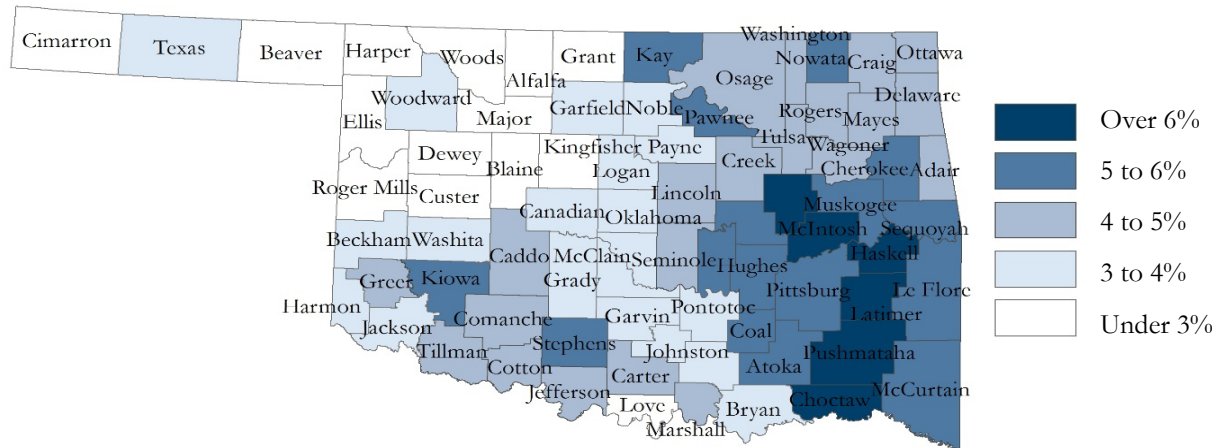

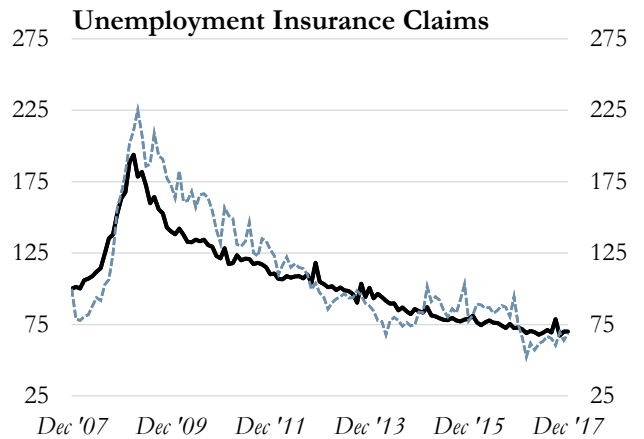

Ten-Year Index of Growth, Seasonally Adjusted

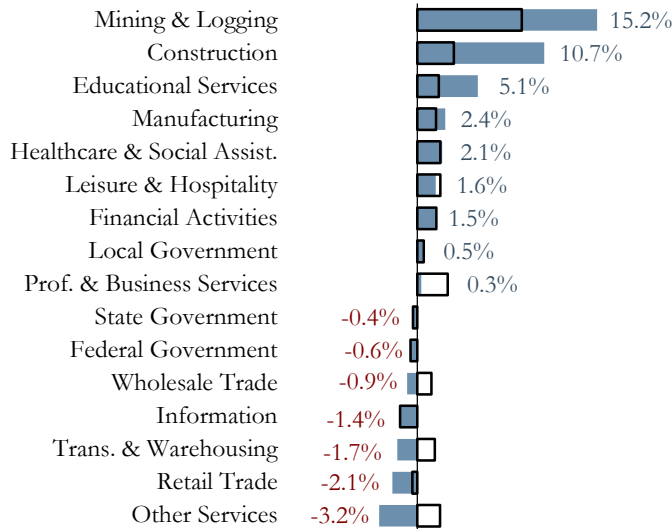

Ten-Year Index of Growth

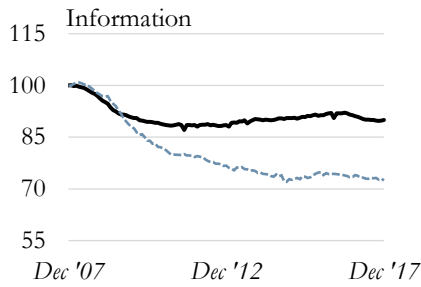

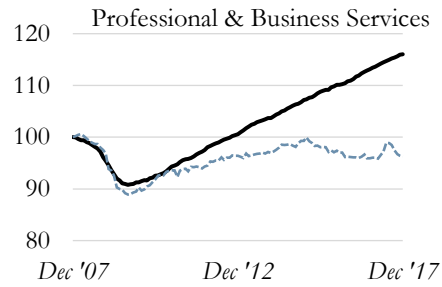
Payroll Employment by Industry

Ten-Year Index of Growth, Seasonally Adjusted

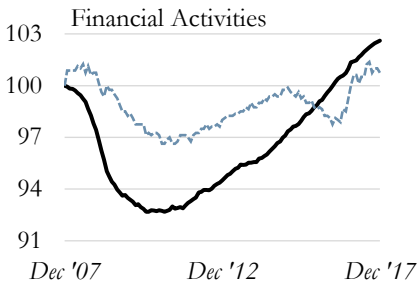

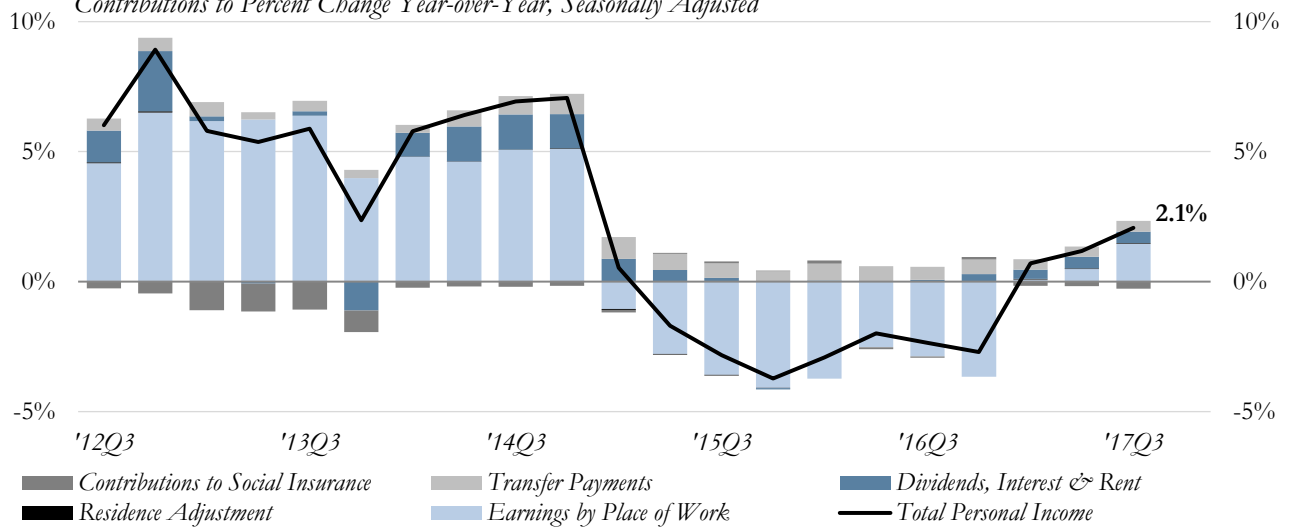

Contributions to Percent Change Year-over-Year, Seasonally Adjusted

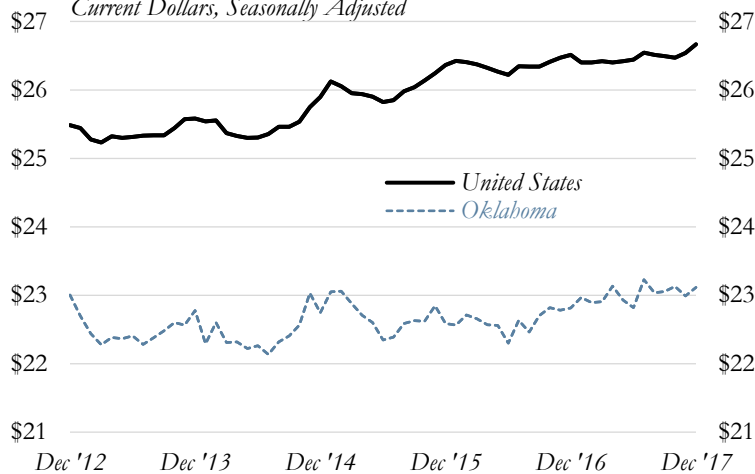

Real Average Hourly Wage

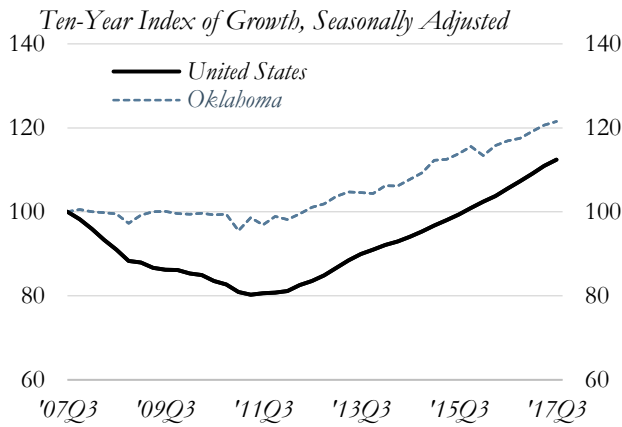

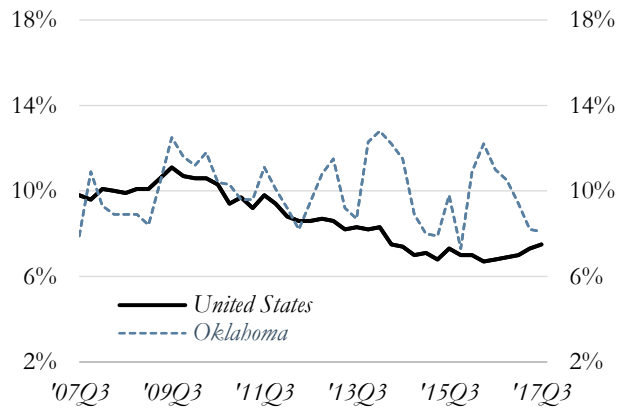

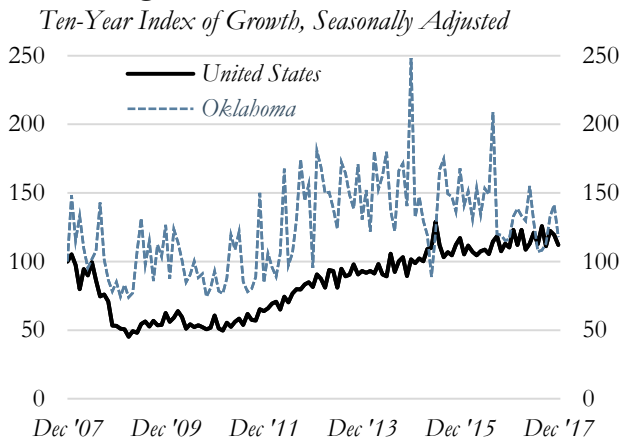
FHFA Purchase-Only Home Price Index

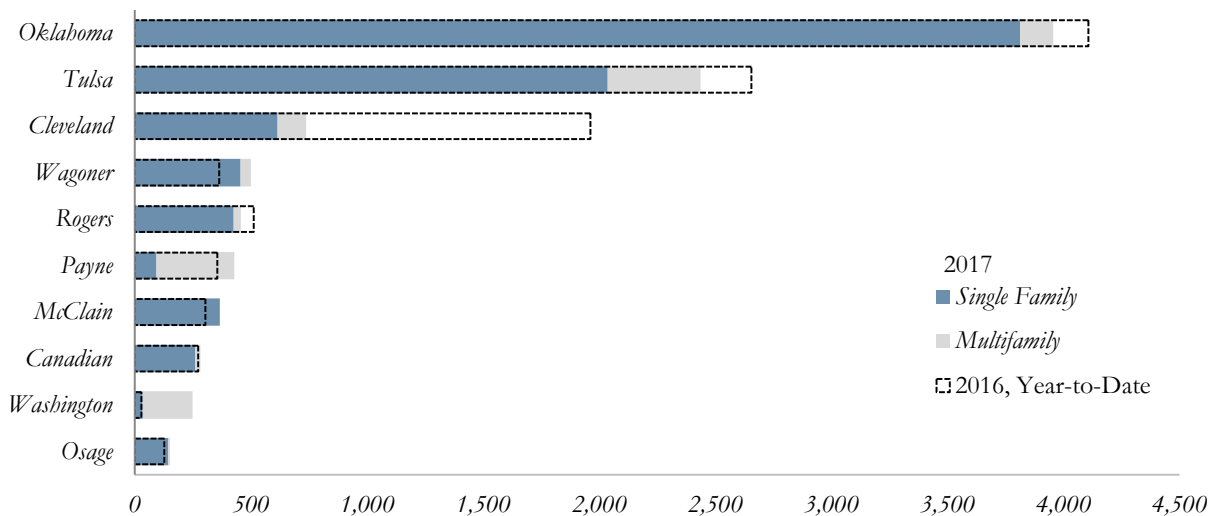

Year-to-Date through December

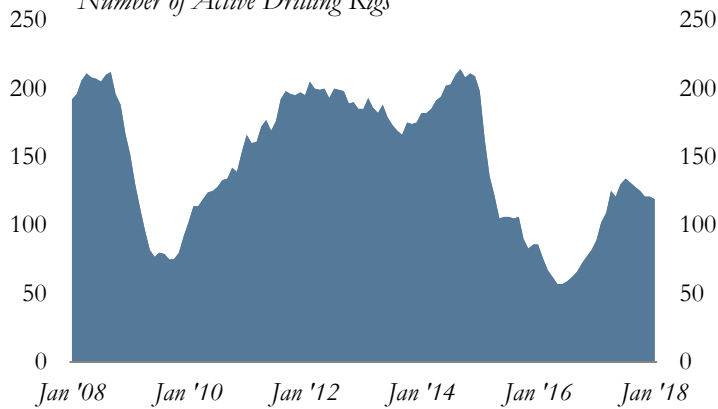

Oil & Gas Rig Counts

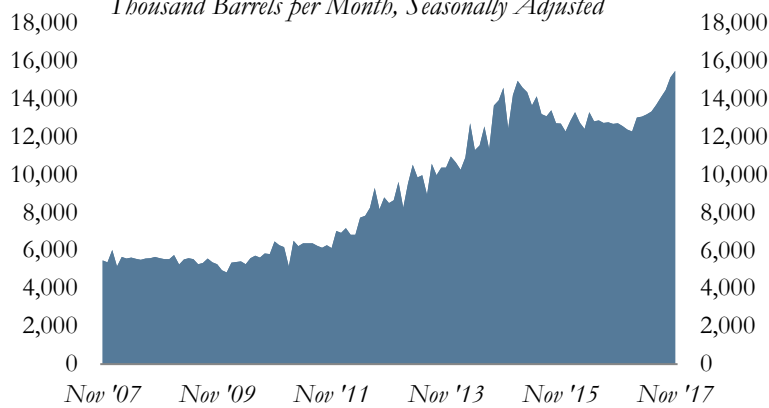

Crude Oil Production

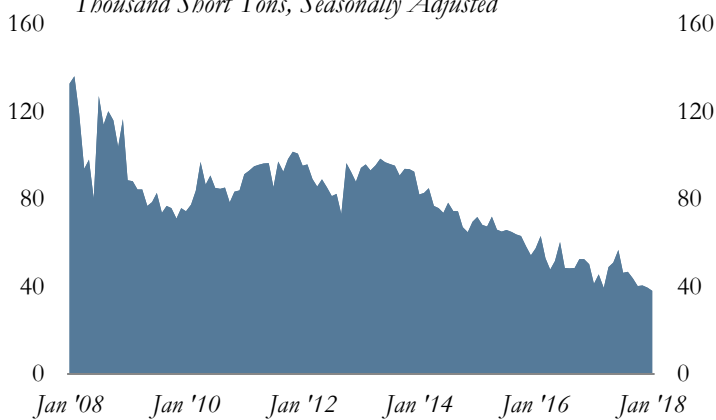

Thousand Short Tons, Seasonally Adjusted

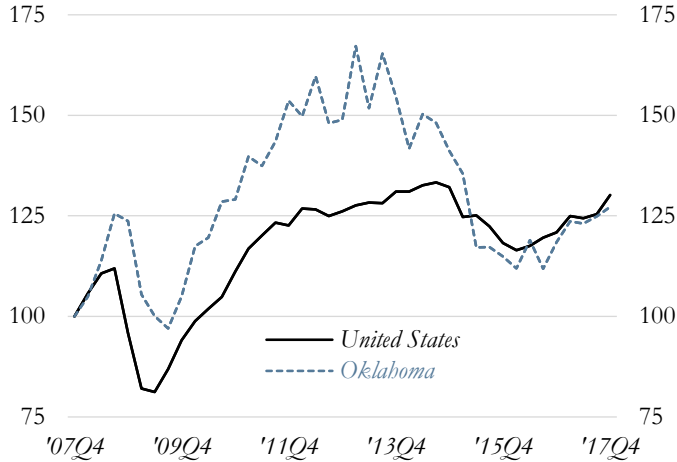

Ten-Year Index of Growth, Seasonally Adjusted

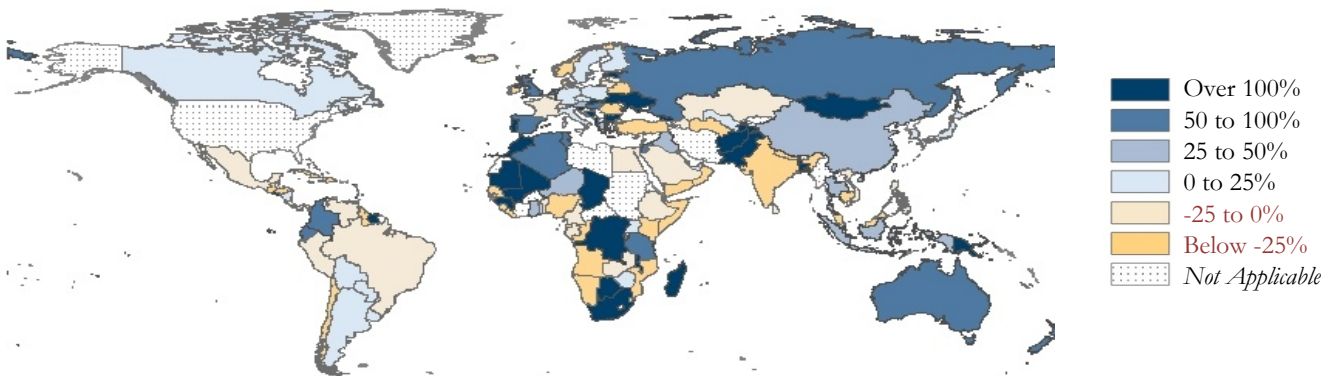
